More recently, Dr Bobby Ramasia, principal executive officer of Bonita's Medical Fund, commented that the 'misalignment' of healthcare stakeholders' agendas is a major private healthcare cost driver. He too called for an end to the finger-pointing which was dominated the healthcare industry.

"The concerns of both the public and private healthcare sectors need to be collectively addressed, including those relating to private healthcare cost escalations, if we are ever to find sustainable solutions that would enable increased access to quality healthcare" says Sebati.

The Competition Commission Inquiry into Health, which is currently underway, was set in motion by the Minister of Health to establish, among others, cost drivers in the private healthcare sector.

Sebati says IPASA welcomes the Competition Commission Inquiry into Health as the outcome of the Inquiry should reveal the true cost drivers in the private healthcare system. "Hopefully, this should end the fragmentation in the healthcare industry and enable us to move forward positively; building a solid foundation for our nation's healthcare system into the future," she says.
